– in commandments and in each other


Julia is staying with her grandfather, who's a rather special character. He sings in a choir and his house is full of things relating to his faith, from saint figurines to proverbs containing commandments. Julia can understand that grandpa's faith forbids you to steal or lie – but then why don't adults always tell the whole truth? And why is it forbidden to kill another person, but fine to kill animals? One day, when Julia accompanies her grandfather to a choir rehearsal, she sees someone stealing: a small boy secretly takes coins from a tray. But when she discovers the real reason for the boy's actions, she realises that the commandment not to steal isn't so straightforward.

Julia questions the world around with disarming honesty. And thereby also helps other people, whether the small boy Hugo, his mother, or her ageing grandfather.



Last year Lemniscaat published SASKIA DE JONG'S debut book, About Meatballs, which immediately won her a nomination for the prize for best children's book debut.

Excitement and adventure in the Stone Age

Some forty thousand years ago, two kinds of human lived in Europe at the same time: the Neanders and a newcomer, Homo sapiens. Eleven-year-old Atta and her clan are Minglers, the result of interbreeding between the two kinds of humans. Atta is sick and tired of continually having to pick berries along with the women and children, while the boys are allowed to go hunting with the men. So she takes matters into her own hands – and finds herself eye to eye with a savage mammoth. She loses her way, is injured and ends up with a tribe of Neanders, who receive her warmly. So warmly, in fact, that she's not sure whether they'll let her go again.


Atta is a cocky and headstrong girl that you'll immediately take to your heart. In this thrilling adventure she gradually comes to a better understanding of both herself and her prejudices. Neander boy Noz is a very charming character as well, who with Atta's help goes through a wonderful evolution. Jolien Janzing brings to life a version of prehistoric times that makes a delightful setting for this exciting story. The atmospheric colour illustrations by Linde Faas make the achievement complete.



JOLIEN JANZING is an author of historical stories both for adults and for children. She has a keen sense of how to shed light on the past and how to connect the local with the global, from fresh and surprising perspectives. She often chooses outstanding women as her central characters. For each book she conducts thorough research but manages to present the historical information in a highly readable way, using a film-like writing style.

Meanwhile, Ben has other things to worry about. It seems as if someone is trying to sabotage his mother's job on the tourist steam boat.


What is going on? Ben and Jula decide to investigate.
