

MYRISTICA and MORGANA. Twins. Aged 16. The same age as



Surely other students could hear that something odd was going on? Twenty girls slept on our floor. Everybody must have heard the struggle, but nobody opened their door.







MARK JANSSEN (Eijsden 1974) studied at the Art Academy in Maastricht. After graduating in 1997 he established himself as a full time illustrator in Valkenburg a/d Geul, where he has his home studio. Mark makes illustrations for all ages. From his first book (Mijn vriend de sjeik by Ulf Stark, Lemniscaat 1997) to 2021, Mark has illustrated over 500 books for Dutch, Belgian and Chinese publishers.

In 2016 Mark successfully started a new oeuvre in his work: writing and illustrating his own picture books. Nothing Happened was published in 2016 and was successfully followed by Dinos Don't Exist (2017), I want a Lion (A. van der Eem, 2017), Island (2018), Stop! Monsters!
