



What is Ezzy carrying with him? What is he up to?



This time Mark Janssen invites us to help two sisters who want to get rid of a trolley full of what seems to be rubbish. But on their way, big scary monsters try to stop them...



Friendship can take the oddest of forms


When Josephine returns to town after a walk in the woods, a tiger strolls along with her. For a moment she's not sure what to do, but then she decides to take him home.



Life is hard for Hens: just like his father, mother and sister, he spends all day working in the dirty and dangerous factory in return for just a handful of change. It is a life of Dickensian gloom. The only bright spot is his little brother Walm, who can't quite keep up with everyone else. A cheerful boy, but not exactly helpful when you're trying to evade the factory supervisor's attention — especially when you forget to take him to the toilet in time.

One morning Hens decides he has had enough, and runs away. But Walm follows in his tracks, and they are soon joined by an annoying and obstinate girl oddly named Five. She has heard of a land where everything is much prettier, and for lack of a better option the three of them set off...

Pieter Koolwijk sketches two worlds that are miles apart, both literally and metaphorically. But is life really better in a land where everything is better, if it is away from your own family? And who on earth is this character named Jool?




A heart-warming debut about friendship and family


Fenna finds herself with more than enough to do!


But then one day a little boy comes to his enclosure. His name is Vos and he has banana peels for Camel – a camel's favourite snack.

That's why, one day, she takes the plunge and knocks on the door of Lidwien, a famous writer who lives across the street. Lidwien is willing to give Katinka writing tips, in exchange for help in the garden.

Lidwien asks Katinka all sorts of questions about what reading and writing mean to her. She teaches her how to formulate and how to observe, and Katinka writes and rewrites her life. It's her way of dealing with the fact that her mother died some years ago, and her father is in love or is having a midlife crisis, or both.


Meanwhile, Katinka hears more and more about Lidwien's own life, which is also worth writing down. As a special friendship develops, Katinka learns about life in general, and almost accidentally writes a whole book.



Joe and Me

It is Joe's last masterful move: when he learns that his life is almost over, he takes his son Woelie on a long train trip. It will be a trip to get to know each other. It will be a trip to help Woelie get his act together. It will be a trip to say goodbye.

We read the story from Woelie's perspective. He starts writing the story of Joe and himself after Joe has died. He speaks directly to us, readers, and starts over and over again, searching for the right anecdote, the right beginning, and the right way to pay tribute to his father.

Since his mother was admitted to a facility, Woelie and his father ran a typical male household. They were silent for more than they talked, but there was always an unconditional bond of trust and they enjoyed each other's company in silence.

Before Joe became ill, Woelie sat at home for months. At first he just stayed in because it was easier than going to school and explaining for the umpteenth time why he didn't do his homework. But as time passed, he found it increasingly difficult to face the world outside.

It didn't really matter to Woelie, however; he liked his life in isolation. He filled his days watching RailAway over and over again, a DVD-series about train travels throughout Europe. Until tragedy struck.

When Joe and Woelie start their memorable last RailAway tour of Europe, their bond becomes increasingly tighter - as their final parting comes rapidly closer.

MIREILLE GEUS is an individual writing coach. She has written numerous children's books for a range of publishers. Her juvenile novel *Piggy* won the most prestigious Dutch children's literature award, de Gouden Griffel, and was nominated for the Deutsche Jugendliteraturpreis. *Joe and Me* is her first YA novel.

A Most Extraordinary Girl


A rich psychological novel in the tradition of magical realism and imaginative narrative

But as the girls grow older, their friendship becomes complicated. While Lot still loves to fantasise about a fanciful fairy world while riding horseback, Sita is increasingly fascinated by real life.

Lot can't grasp what her best friend is getting at, and she feels let down. To make matters worse, the dream of a long and happy life in Spain suddenly comes to an end, as Sita's parents cannot maintain their retreat due to an economic crisis and Lot's parents decide to split up. Lot's father stays in Spain, but all the others move back to the Netherlands.

The contrast between warm-blooded Spain and the chilly Netherlands couldn't have hit harder. Lot and her mother have to build up a new life together. Then Lot discovers that Sita has been keeping a big secret.


What was done to Angelo is irreversible. His voice will never change. He will never have children. He will never get married.

Zafón and Marquez move over... here is Rauwerda!


Jonas has been suffering terrible headaches for quite some time. Just when he is home alone, the headaches become almost unbearable. That's when strange things start to happen. One night, while Jonas is asleep, there is a burglary. When he wakes up the next morning, he discovers that the uninvited guest has cleaned the room and left a big book.

In the book, Jonas reads about a rather peculiar house. When he finds out, later that day, that a house has appeared where there was still an undeveloped field the day before, he can't control his curiosity and decides to enter...

The house gets a hold on Jonas. Like Alice in Wonderland, he wanders from room to room, and from one bizarre situation to the next. While his head is throbbing, all sorts of events and stories take place that seem to bounce back and forth between dream and reality.

Will Jonas be able to escape from the clutches of the house?

Peter-Paul Rauwerda wrote a hypnotic, psychological story in which the reader, just as Jonas, is torn between reality and fantasy. In a colourful language reminiscent of the books by Zafón and Marquez, Rauwerda paints a world that will linger long after the book is closed.

With Mr Bergmans, Guido Bottinga has created a man we would all love to meet in our lives. *White holes* is an ode to wonder and to eternal friendship.




